WOLKBERG

Route Book

Wolkberg is an area in the New Agatha Forest Wilderness Area near Tzaneen in the North-eastern Transvaal.

The MCSA owns a hut in the Wilderness Area which is an excellent base to enjoy the walking and rock climbing potential of the area.

Wolkberg is usually approached from Pietersberg along the Tzaneen road. Turn right just past Haenertsburg and right again after about 10km into the Georges Valley which is followed for a further 10km, through a narrow section, to a Forest Guards house where the car must be left. From here a two hour walk brings one to the hut.

A Wilderness Permitt is required and the Secretary of the Transvaal Section of the MCSA must be contacted at least two week prior to any proposed visit for permission (and the hut keys!).

The Wolkebrg "Sisters" are the obvious line of cliffs to the south of the hut. They are numbered from left-to-right with the Fifth Sister hidden behind the Fourth Sister. The cleaner but harder rock climbs tend to be on the Fourth and Fifth Sisters. The First Sister is also known as Wolkberg Mountain or Serala. The horns are reached by traversing to the left of the First Sister along the Tabina track and are well worth a visit.

The recommended season is Winter when, although cold, clear weather can be expected.

Several routes in this book are either not marked on the photos or have not been written up.

Wolkberg - First Sister

KOEKSISTER F2

1.1.

Start at the base of a large boulder about 20m to the left of Buenos Aires (about 3m right of a large gully, small overhanging red face on right).

1 F1 30m Climb to the right of the boulder up a small crack/chimney (C). Climb face (can do a chimney move behind a large block/pinnacle) till a large grassy ledge is reached. Traverse to the left and move up on a face with large holes. Belay on a grassy ledge (has a small tree on it). One fixed piton about 20m up.

2 F1 35m Continue up corner through a wide crack. Then traverse horizontally to the left across the face (there is a fixed piton here). Climb around corner to a small ledge on the side of the gully (there is a tree just below this). Most of this pitch is E3 with a few F1 moves.

3 F2 40m Climb the small corner crack for about 2m then traverse to the right (delicate move - crux - possibly F3). Then climb to the left and up through a short open book (E). Then go slightly right up a shallow gully with grass and unstable rocks at the top. Most of this pitch is E3 and F1.

4 D 45m Continue up slight gully (D) then scramble to top (C).

Wolkberg - First Sister

BUENOS AIRES F2

1.2.

Start left of 10m pinnacle/buttness with tree growing on its front. (Cairn)

1 F1 20m Ascend a thin face for 7m, moving diagonally to the left as one ascends. Belay from a tree in a recess to the left of a platform.

2 E2 30m Move to the right along this ledge and climb a shallow recess with large holds.

3 E3 20m Move some 7m horizontally to the left until an overhang is reached. Continue underneath the overhang on thin footholds. Once past the overhang, scramble to the top of the pitch into a cluster of trees. Alternatively, when the overhang is reached, ascend diagonally to the right to the top of the pitch. This is slightly more difficult but no more than E in standard.

4 F1 100m Take off directly out of a cluster of trees, moving slightly to the left at first, then follow the easiest line. There are two fixed pitons on this pitch.

First ascent: 1959 B.Magg, B.Hunt and J.Clayton.

BELLE AIRE F2

1.3.

Start as for Buenos Aires. Climb follows the same buttness and crosses to the left for the second pitch, Otherwise going a few metres right of the earlier route.

1 F2 22m Climb the face 1m right of the crack followed by Buenos Aires and keep on small holds near right corner to large ledge (double nut belay).

2 F2 33m Walk left 5m (across Buenos Aires) and climb face two moves to little overhang. Go left around corner, move up and right above bulge (crux) and then straight up to ledge. Continue up face and open book to reach traverse ledge of Buenos Aires where it goes up right crack of a short block. Take left crack around block and up left on ledges under big red overhang. Belay at good nut crack below left edge of overhang.

Wolkberg - First Sister

3 F2 15m Move directly up crack to near left corner of overhang, thread a runner and traverse right across to right corner. Continue up and right to reach large ledge above. Double nut belay.

4 F2 35m Ascend face somewhat to right via a small crack to top of corner block. Take two moves on small knobs and holes straight up, then stretch left to more small holds on face (crux) above overhang. Move directly up and somewhat right to easier going above ledge, continuing to belay where climbing becomes grade C or less.

First ascent: 29.12.77 T.Choate and A.Suessegger.

PATIENCE F3

1.4.

Start about 20m to the right of Buenos Aires, just right of undercut recess/crack. There is a beacon at the start.

1 F2 Climb a large block and go over an overhang using a large projecting flake. Continue up the face to a stance at the bottom of an open book.

2 F1 Continue up the open book and by-pass a large overhang on the right-hand side. Come back on to the original line by traversing to the left to the top of a large block.

3 F3 Climb a face to the left of the large block (crux move) and continue to the top.

This is a sustained route on good rock with lots of protection, especially by means of chocks and wedges.

First ascent: Date unknown. C.Cowley and

Wolkberg - First Sister

SKID MARKS F3,M1

1.5.

This route lies between Cadenza Crag and Patience. Three pegs were left in place.

1 F3 40m Start on the left hand side of the gully. Climb a 5m wall to a tree, then climb straight up the face. Scramble up to a grass-covered ledge and follow this for 6m. Traverse to the right through some bushes until under a slab with a yellow wall above.

2 F1 10m Climb the slab to a good ledge and belay.

3 F1,M1 25m Climb up to the left until in a corner under an overhang. Traverse to the right to a nose (loose). Continue traversing (M1) for 3m to the "lobe" of an "ear", then climb straight up 6m to a ledge. Traverse about 6m to the left. Free climbing leads to a stance.

4 F2 13m Climb straight up a break, then to the right through an overhang. (There is a loose block on the overhang.)

First ascent: 30.12.70 H.Vogl and C.Ward.

CADENZA CRAG F3

1.6.

This route can be recognised as a thin line 16m to the right of the upright of an inverted-crown wedge.

1 E2 25m Start in the gully. Climb 6m up the face, then enter a crack. There is a good sling-point further up the crack. Emerge from the crack onto the face again and ascend a further 13m. There is a good tree belay on top of a large block.

Wolkberg - First Sister

SKID MARKS F3,M1

1.5.

This route lies between Cadenza Crag and Patience. Three pegs were left in place.

1 F3 40m Start on the left hand side of the gully. Climb a 5m wall to a tree, then climb straight up the face. Scramble up to a grass-covered ledge and follow this for 6m. Traverse to the right through some bushes until under a slab with a yellow wall above.

2 F1 10m Climb the slab to a good ledge and belay.

3 F1,M1 25m Climb up to the left until in a corner under an overhang. Traverse to the right to a nose (loose). Continue traversing (M1) for 3m to the "lobe" of an "ear", then climb straight up 6m to a ledge. Traverse about 6m to the left. Free climbing leads to a stance.

4 F2 13m Climb straight up a break, then to the right through an overhang. (There is a loose block on the overhang.)

First ascent: 30.12.70 H.Vogl and C.Ward.

CADENZA CRAG F3

1.6.

This route can be recognised as a thin line 16m to the right of the upright of an inverted-crown wedge.

1 E2 25m Start in the gully. Climb 6m up the face, then enter a crack. There is a good sling-point further up the crack. Emerge from the crack onto the face again and ascend a further 13m. There is a good tree belay on top of a large block.

Looking up from the Hut one cannot fail to notice the V-sign formed by two deep cracks on the face of the peak and very pronounced in the early morning. Scrambling takes one into the crack, which is larger than one at first supposes. After a short distance a gully blocked by an enormous chockstone enters from the right. Commence climbing up the vertical section of the main crack.

1 D 25m A pleasant pitch gives access to the deeper part of the crack which could now be classed as a narrow water course.

2 D 3m Climb over a large boulder wedged in the crack and blocking the way. The crack continues to a deep cave-like recess formed by large boulders.

3 D 6m A short vertical ascent to the roof of the cave is followed by a climbing traverse to the right, which gives access to a small narrow passage about 3m wide, the only way through and awkward to negotiate. Proceed a further 5m to the right to a good stance under an overhang with a conveniently placed tree for belaying the leader.

4 E1 4m The overhang is turned on the left-hand side and a good move follows to the right above the overhang to another tree.

5 E1 7m The 3m tree, though small and wobbly, is bent at the top and enabled us to turn another overhang. The move from the tree to the face is awkward as only a rather inadequate foothold is available. Delicate moves on small grips complete the climb. The route continues up to the left, behind some trees to a large stance at the foot of a recess.

6 C 10m This completes the difficult section up the right-hand wall. Easy scrambling over boulders and through trees accounted for the final 32m of the crack.

First ascent: Date unknown. A.H.Doble and V.Cheek.

NAT PAD E1

1.9.

The climb starts lower down in the same gully as Frontal and lies between Frontal and Adder Face.

1 E1 35m Climb crack on right side of gully opposite grey rocks leading to second part of gully leading to start of Frontal. Proceed in crack up 15m and then on left through bush to large yellow-wood tree below cave.

2 D 22m Climb into cave toward faint light at top, passing narrow slit on right (facing in). Crawl through opening at top onto large dassie platform (hole size about 500mm!).

3 D 30m Climb straight up on broken but interesting face or scramble to top by gully to right.

Note: First two pitches done in wet conditions, grading may differ when dry.

First ascent: 24.12.73 S.van Rensburg and four sons (Helgaard, Sarel, Dirk and Pieter).

ADDER FACE F2

1.10.

This route is situated just to the right of the main recess in which Frontal goes, and follows a direct line up to a very striking crack (3m long) between two large rocks about 65m up.

1 F2 24m Climb diagonally to the right on a cut-in slab for 8m, starting 3m from the right-hand corner of the main recess. Traverse 6m to the left (delicate) and climb the left-hand corner of the face for 20m to a long ledge level with two bushes.

2 F1 40m Ascend the crack on the right-hand side of the ledge and continue directly up the face, passing the overhangs on the left to a large ledge directly below the crack described at the beginning.

Wolkberg - First Sister

3 F2 33m Ascend a crack (lay-back) and climb more easily (D/E) to the top. Alternatively, traverse to the right and scramble to the top. This is an easier way than climbing the crack.

Note: This is a very pleasant climb with good rock, and no bush, and not too much lichen.

First ascent: 5.9.71 P.Dawson and N.Heidstra.

ADDER SKOORSTEEN F2

1.11.

Start at the same point as Adder Face (5m to right of large gully).

1 F1 40m Traverse diagonally to the right as in Adder Face but continue doing so for 20m. Then traverse across a bushy ledge. Climb the next crack from the left of Adder Face's (very obvious). Climb as far as possible to overhang, then traverse out to the right onto face just enough to continue up. The stance is on the first ledge in the crack (small).

2a F2 20m Climb crack for about 5m (crux) and then at overhang climb out of the chimney onto left face. Climb up about 1m and then traverse diagonally to the left (the crack above is a bit too overgrown to continue up). Belay from a large broken ledge (you are now back on Adder Face).

2b F2 40m Climb as above but after leaving chimney ascend diagonally left to just before overhang (sling point); then traverse back to the chimney up past some very big aloes to a large ledge.

3a F2 33m Finish as for Adder Face.

3b F2 30m Scramble up to a large face. This pitch starts at the top of some boulders about 10m to the left of a very big yellowwood tree. The climb goes through a small break in the overhangs just to the right of the boulders. After overhang, ascend a grassy gully immediately to the left of the big face.

ERAM SCERAM F3

1.12.

Start 30m to the left of a cluster of trees on a large boulder.

1 E1 30m Climb diagonally to the right (20m C) below an overhang. Traverse 5m to the right (E). Belay in a corner.

2 F1 40m Climb the corner (strenuous F1) to a large tree (5m). Traverse to the left and climb up diagonally to the left across a face, to the bottom of an open crack (slingspoint).

3 F2 35m Climb up the right-hand corner of an open crack to a piton, then continue vertically for 3m (F) to below an overhang. Traverse 3m to the left and climb up into a large cubby hole.

4 F3 40m Climb out of the cubby hole on the right, if facing the climb, around a corner and then straight up and back into the crack. Follow an open crack to an "open book" which you climb directly (F) or on the right (F1) to a tree.

5 F1 10m Climb a large boulder in the center, vertically up to the top.

6 F1 20m Descend from the boulder and climb a face in the vertical line. There is a piton belay halfway up.

Note: Pitches 3, 4, 5 and 6 are in a vertical line up the buttress.

First ascent: Date unknown. H. Vogl, H. Leibsich and D. Charlton.

AFTERNOON STROLL F1

1.13.

No description available.

PUTZFRAU MIT BESEN F3,M1

1.14.

Not marked on photo.

Follow gully between First Sister and Second Sister south and downwards and cross right underneath rock faces until you find prominent 90° open book, 100m after gully.

1 F1 10m Up open book and scramble 50m through bush to start of gully between main face and pinnacle. Belay in hole at start of recess.

2 F1 20m Climb up left side of recess as far as trees. Traverse to right and climb up corner with layback moves, and back into gully.

3 Scramble up gully to saddle and belay at top.

4 F3,M1 25m Climb up obvious crack on pinnacle which starts from saddle. Abseil from block 5m below summit.

5 F2 40m Climb main face from saddle 5m then move diagonally right for 4m and back left to ledge which leads in with steps well below large overhang with belay in good crack.

6 F2 35m Traverse back 3m and up into recess. Climb up 3m in recess and traverse right and up around bush. Carry on in obvious crack and move diagonally right to top of face.

First ascent: Date unknown. H.Seuring.

Wolkberg - Second Sister

FREJUS D

2.1.

This climb follows the thin crack line up the centre of the face at the left-hand end of the 2nd Sister.

1 D 40m Start at cairn and climb directly up 40m.

2 D 20m Continue directly to summit.

First ascent: 13.7.78 D.Meyer and L.McNeill.

LATE NIGHT FINAL E3

2.2.

This climb commences just left of white column, below right-hand end of reddish overhang.

1 D/E 25m Climb rib to overhang, then continue past overhang to belay below second overhang.

2 E3 30m Traverse to right on vegetated footholds for 3m, then up and back left to ledge below rock face. Climb face to grassy terrace.

3 D 25m Continue to top by most obvious rock route.

First ascent: 8.7.74 P.Goodridge and J.W.Outhwaite

WHITE COLUMN E2

2.3.

Start a third of the way along the Second Sister at a beacon some 10m to the left of the beacon marking the start of Cook's Tour.

1 D 12m Climb in a corner and up a wall, angling to the right to a stance on a grassy ledge.

2 D 21m Continue up, bearing to the right past a wide crack which is closed off by a ceiling and up a grassy crack to a stance on top of a "white" column.

3 E2 31m Climb straight up above the stance on good clean rock to the top of the cliff.

First ascent: 29.3.70 J.Clayton and J.W.Outhwaite.

Wolkberg - Second Sister

BURNT OFFERING F2

2.4.

This climb goes through the open book high on the 2nd Sister above the start of Cook's Tour. Start at cairn between White Column and Cook's Tour.

1 E2 40m Climb up about 18m, then diagonally up right for 6m, then up a crack and continue to small stance.

2 F2 40m Continue up about 20m (piton at about 10m) to some overhanging blocks. Move up at left of overhang then traverse right into crack. Climb crack (12m) and then continue up easy rock to summit.

This climb was opened shortly after a fire had cleaned the face of vegetation.

First ascent: 13.7.78 D.Meyer and L.McNeill.

COOK'S TOUR E2

2.5.

Start about a third of the way along the Second Sister, at a small beacon directly below an open book high on the krantz.

1 E1 28m Climb vertically up a broken face for 2m, to a slight overhang (piton runner), then horizontally to the right for 5m to a grass corner with a large block belay

2 E1 31m Climb straight up above the block. Follow the right-hand side of a wide crack initially, then continue up lichen-covered rock to the underside of a nose. Traverse to the right under the nose over broken rock, then along a ledge to a belay point at a small bush in a grassy corner.

3 E2 19m Ascend 5m up a corner crack (crux) then traverse to the right, heading for a tree below a pinnacle leaning against the face. Belay around the tree.

Wolkberg - Second Sister

4 E1 23m Bridge up the corner and pass through on to the right-hand side of the pinnacle. Continue to the top past the chockstones.

First ascent: 28.3.70 W.G.Hewitt, D.P.Hughes and J.W.Outhwaite.

A DAY IN THE LIFE E3

2.6.

The climb starts to the right of a big cleft in the base of an obvious ramp sloping to the right.

1 D/E Climb ramp to ledge and block belay (this is vegetated).

2 E3 To the left is a jutting block at the end of an overhang and above is a smoothish face. Traverse left to the face and up a small, exposed open book (E1 - peg left in place). Continue to a big ledge and subsequently straight up over rock covered with jutting out bits (E3). Block belay (large block).

3a D Follow a nasty gully to the top.

3b F2 Continue up on arete on right (only climbed halfway).

Note: Climb done in wet and mist. Grading probably incorrect.

First ascent: Jan 74 R.P.Cooper and T.M.Hoy.

Wolkberg - Second Sister

ANT HEAP F1

2.7.

Start two-thirds of the way along krantz, about 10m left of beacon marking Straight Face, and 4m right of a large tree (small beacon made).

1 E2 25m Climb up recess for about 15m until first obvious break on left allows one onto left-hand buttress. Traverse round to largish ledge with tree belay.

2 F1 25m Climb up behind tree to small overhang, then step left around large block (crux) onto grassy ledge. Continue straight up face to base of chimney crack.

3 E2 30m Ascend crack on left to ledge, then up face bearing right to edge, then straight up past left-hand edge of overhang to ledge.

4 D/E 20m Climb straight up to top of krantz on good clean easy rock.

Note: Subsequent climbers indicate pitches 1 and 2 may be done together and total about 40m.

First ascent: 11.12.72 W.G.Hewitt and
J.W.Outhwaite.

AMERICAN JAM F1

2.8.

This climb begins at the same point as Ant Heap, about 10m left of Straight Face and a few metres right of a large tree (first 30m are the same as Ant Heap).

1 F1 40m Climb up the face towards the left. At overhang go right and up past tree, up a slightly overhanging crack. Then move up, through a few small trees to an obvious roof. Here traverse to the left directly under the overhang onto a grass ledge (first crux). Move slightly left up a delicate face. Here the climb differs from Ant Heap. Move to the right to a large grassy ledge and belay on a tree (a large overhang is to right).

Wolkberg - Second Sister

2 E2 25m Climb up the chimney on the right, through a number of bushes, and stop a little bit above the first grassy ledge on the right.

3 F1 25m Continue through a tree and up the chimney above (3m). Traverse left out on the face for a few metres to a vertical crack through an overhanging block (second crux) and up onto a grassy ledge to the left. Then traverse to the right through a few trees, then up to a large ledge with a big tree on it (now to the right of the big overhang).

4 E1 40m Climb up corner and then slightly to the right on easier rock (D).

5 C Scramble to the top.

First ascent: Easter 76 H.van Rensburg, J.Moore and H.van Eeden.

STRAIGHT FACE E3

2.9.

Start 6m to the right of two large trees directly against the rock face. There are two overhangs visible 15 and 25m up above the cutback to the right of the trees. This climb is 2/3 along the 2nd Sister.

1 E2 25m Climb 6m up crack in face, then over to the left-hand corner of the face and straight up to a ledge on the right-hand side of an overhang. (Climb the crack in the rock under the overhang for good clean rock.) There is a piton belay. Good nut point.

2 E2 35m Start on the left of the belay point. Move 3m to the right and then 3m up diagonally to the left towards a small tree. Climb to the left up a corner to a ledge with a long flat stone on it. Belay from the flat rock.

3 E3 35m Climb straight from the right-hand edge of the stance in a crack, to a block belay on a small bushy ledge. Ascend diagonally left and then up a thin face into a shallow recess and up to the top.

First ascent: 1958 B.Magg, B.Hunt and H.Foers.

Wolkberg - Second Sister

MISTAKE F1

2.10.

Start 2m to the right of Straight Face.

1 E2 23m Climb up 3m, then move diagonally left toward overhang. Make stance 2m directly below overhang.

2 F1 20m Climb past the first stance piton of Straight Face and then left of the overhang. Move directly up to large ledge with a lot of vegetation on it.

3 E3 30m Move left from stance into crack and proceed up to small overhang in crack. Belay on nut at small ledge.

4 E3 11m Traverse left out of crack 3m round an exposed corner and go directly up to top.

First ascent: 27.12.77 P.Lazarus and Roger.

ALPHA CILLIN E3

2.11.

Start on top of boulders directly below long column of rock high up on buttress. Small beacon.

1 E3 30m Climb straight up above beacon to below vertical face. Traverse left about 2m then up face on right of tree-filled gully to belay on grassy ledge.

2 Scramble to base of column.

3 E3 30m Climb chimney crack on right of column, passing two large chockstones. Tree or chock belay.

4 E2 15m Continue up groove above belay, mainly bridging to top.

First ascent: 8.8.74 P.Goodridge and J.W.Outhwaite

RED FINGER E2

2.12.

Not marked on photo. **May be on the 3rd Sister.**

The climb is situated on the 2nd Sister about one-third of the way along. It is marked by a beacon and starts below and slightly to the left of a large finger of red high up on an overhanging buttress.

1 D 12m Climb up and right to piton belay.

2 E2 20m Climb up slightly right to crack. Ascend crack and up to stance to left of overhanging nose. Piton belay.

3 E2 16m Traverse right and up under overhanging nose to ledge and along ledge to recess. Piton belay.

4 E2 20m Climb recess and straight up under overhang. Traverse left onto nose and up to stance. Piton belay.

5 E2 16m Starting on right-hand corner, ascend face to summit.

First ascent: 28.8.67 T.Shaw and D.Rogers.

Wolkberg - Second Sister

BIRTHDAY FACE F2

2.13.

Not marked on photo. **May be on the 3rd Sister.**

The climb is situated in approximately the middle of the 2nd Sister. It is recognised by what appears to be a steep, holdless face halfway up the rock, this face being the object of the climb. The climb is marked by a beacon and starts to the left of the face.

1 F2 30m Climb up 2m then traverse diagonally right round to a far corner and a large ledge. Tree belay.

2 F2 30m From left-hand end of ledge step up left onto ledge on corner. Traverse left for a few feet (tricky) and climb up under overhang. Traverse right and up to stance. Piton belay.

3 F2 30m Climb up 3m and traverse left round corner. Ascend steep face on good holds and finish on ledge to the right. Piton belay.

4 F2 16m Ascend face to top, finishing left. Tree belay.

5 D 35m Scramble to summit.

First ascent: 28.8.67 T.Shaw and D.Rogers.

MAMBA KRAAK F3

3.1.

Start on the left side of the Sister (as seen from the hut) to the left of Merry Christmas. The climb begins in a cave-like chimney to the right of a very prominent overhang (about 10m above). Scramble up recess and begin at tree in the back.

1 F1 25m Climb up chimney to roof, then traverse outward along the top. At the end of the chimney (10m) traverse onto face, under overhang (left as seen from hut). Traverse along base of the face below roof (higher route is at least G1, unprotected) to the left extreme of the overhang and then move up to a small stance; belay from tree and vertical crack.

2 F3 15m (or F2,M1) Climb follows an obvious vertical corner just to the left of the overhang. Climb the crack for about 8m (crux, piton left in place). At the first obvious ledge, traverse right out of the crack and onto the main buttress. Climb up a few metres to large belay ledge with tree.

3 E2 40m This pitch continues to the right of the large ledge. It follows the easiest line of ascent vertically up delicate face climbing.

4 C 20m Scramble to top.

First ascent: Easter 76 H.van Rensburg and J.Moore

MERRY CHRISTMAS F2

3.2.

Climb starts from second cave from left-hand side of 3rd Sister.

1 F2 33m Climb left-hand corner of cave and up smooth orange face to crack below overhang. Move 2m left to open book and climb this through overhang. Continue up face and chimney to large chockstone. Belay on chockstone or tree just above.

2 E3 40m Continue about 20m up chimney and then move out left and continue up obvious rock route to summit.

First ascent: 25.12.72 M.Prior and A.McGarr.

Wolkberg - Third Sister

SUNSET OVERHANG F1

3.3.

Start one-third of the way along (from left, before large tree clump) where a wandering, vegetated crack ends in a large overhang near top (which meets a gully converging from the right).

- 1 E3 15m Ascend crack, moving out onto face occasionally.
- 2 F1 15m Move out to right 3m, then diagonally up and back into crack. Belay at bush in narrow stance.
- 3 F1 20m Move out to right from tree about 3m, then back into crack onto ledge. Move up 3m, then traverse left to corner. Ascend corner to large tree.
- 4 E3 40m Traverse right 10m, then move up and around corner of overhang into gully. Ascend gully to top.

First ascent: 1.9.73 M.Prior and S.van Rensburg.

LIZZARD F2

3.4.

This climb starts at a position in the centre of the Third Sister, in a recess near a clump of trees, and may start the same as Black Scorpion on the left of the crack, but appears to follow a crack to the ledge.

- 1 E2 23m Over overhang continue crack climbing on the left face (15m) and return into crack until you reach the bushy stance.
- 2 E2 22m Traverse off the stance over a wide band to the right out to the face and continue to climb straight up.
- 3 E2 32m Approach the face and ascend in the middle about 10m, then traverse to the right. Follow crack up to little platform stance at 26m or continue up crack another 6m to good stance/band under final wall.

Wolkberg - Third Sister

4 F2 22m Ascend face straight for 4m, then traverse slightly to the right and then back to the left to vertical line. Follow vertical crack to little tree and to overhang (piton 3m below this). Climb overhang following crack on its right side.

First ascent: 5.1.73 E.Mettler and V.Munch.

BLACK SCORPION F2

3.5.

On the Third Sister there is a mass of trees in the centre. In the opening on the right there is a deep crack or recess with a well-defined crack above it which continues to the top of the krantz. The climb goes more or less straight up on the left of the crack. Climb up to the right of the clump of trees for a few feet and traverse to the right as far as the corner where there is a big block.

1 E2 10m This goes up the ridge for about 3m then on the face to the right as far as a wide ledge.

2 E2 13m This continues up the face of the ridge to a bushy stance, fit for three. The stance is slightly to the right of the start.

3 E2 16m Traverse off the stance to the left and climb up to a ledge. The route is on a face.

4 E2 31m This pitch goes up and into a crack. Climb straight up above the crack to a stance 30m above the belay. Two slings at least can be placed.

5 F2 13m Climb up directly above the stance, traverse to the left for a few metres and climb to the top.

Note: This climb should be very pleasant with dry rock as it is quite fair on wet rock. The first pitch is a little scruffy but after that the rock is clean for Wolkberg.

First ascent: 22.3.51 R.Latham, L.C.Thompson and D.R.Bell.

Wolkberg - Third Sister

BLACK GROTTO

3.6.

No description available.

GORGEOUS GARDEN E3

3.7.

1 E2 15m Move diagonally right towards prominent crack pulling round a small tree to gain ledge with tree.

2 E1 25m Move up 5m then into chimney. Move up chimney. Belay at top of chimney in small cave.

3 E3 25m Traverse left for 8m then move up face for 7m. Traverse right under toppled rock tower back into chimney.

4 E3 33m Ascend toppled tower and move up crack directly above it. Move up broken chimney /face keeping right as much as possible. Stance at large yellowwood tree. (This is the gorgeous garden pitch).

5 E3 25m Ascend large pinnacle until 1m from the summit. At this point a fall across must be negotiated. A running belay can be fixed around a large boulder at this point. Move leftwards up mother wall to the final summit.

Note: The fall across could be graded F1 from the exposure point of view.

First ascent: 15.9.79 G.Langmore and M.Power.

FRANZL WEG F1

3.8.

No description available.

Start about 120m from right of 3rd Sister, between first and second very prominent clefts.

1 E1 35m Scramble onto boulder shelf about 20m to right of Austrian route to belay at start of climb. Go diagonally up left 10m then diagonally right to corner dropping onto chockstone in cleft. Ascend past large tree into large cubby hole. Belay off nuts in crack.

2 F1 40m Ascend the cleft, emerge on right face then onto top of rounded pinnacle (from behind). Step across from top onto face and ascend on thin holds, zig-zagging into recess with trees for belay.

3 F1 30m Move out left, climb face to top of second pinnacle. Step across onto grassy face, climb diagonally right then left and into bottom of chimney. Then:

- a) Climb 2-3m up cleft, hand-traverse right onto corner and then zig-zag to stance over grass above chimney (F1), or
- b) Climb chimney and emerge on left side into stance on grassy ledge with tree belay (F2).

4 E3 35m Ascend 4m in chimney, traverse right around corner and then further 6m to end of grassy ledge. Ascend zig-zagging straight up, staying on rock as far as possible. Scramble last section.

Note: Pinnacles are not conspicuous. Grassy section dangerous when wet

First ascent: 11.10.75 K.Bennetts and J.Brittain.

Wolkberg - Third Sister

AUSTRIAN ROUTE E2

3.10.

This starts near the right-hand end of the Third Sister and is cairned. Grades and distances incomplete.

- 1 Climb 12m straight upwards under small overhang and pass over it on the right side. Continue 7m straight up to stance.
- 2 Go 4m left on sill and follow crack up to right side under overhang and further to cave stance.
- 3 35m Go out on face 2m right and follow up crack to next stance .
- 4 20m Climb face straight up to grassy spot.
- 5 E2 Climb straight up the face and continue to top.

First ascent: 25.12.72 F.Schoch and H.Lingerank.

Wolkberg - Fourth Sister

LATE START PINNACLE E3

4.1.

- 1 E3 20m Ascend front of small pinnacle, starting from gully on left. Traverse into gully.
- 2 E3 40m Traverse left 5m and ascend face to steep gully. Climb gully, then traverse left 2m to stance on steep buttress.
- 3 D/E2 Ascend gully and easy face, then vertically up small steep face.

First ascent: M.Prior and K.McGrath.

MAD DOG F3

4.2.

No description available.

FIRE-BREAK F3

4.3.

Starts about quarter way along krantz in centre of a recess formed by a protruding buttress on the left and a large leaning block on the right. Beacon.

- 1 F1 20m (Protection reported absent.) Ascend crack to top of block (8m). Traverse horizontally to right for about 5m. Then climb sloping scoop to base of wide crack with a single aloë. Chockstone belay.
- 2 F3 25m Semi-chimney up crack for 5m. Above here the crack narrows and is blocked by grass and other vegetation, so traverse left onto wall and climb delicately (crux) bearing slightly right back into crack. Continue up past large tree to a ledge in a corner. Belay to small bushes.
- 3 D 25m Traverse right, around corner, to another rather dirty corner and ascend past tree to base of a large chimney.
- 4 F1 20m Ascend chimney to top of krantz. About halfway up one sees daylight through the chimney and at top a small pinnacle is formed. (Beacon placed here.)

First ascent: 13.12.72 J.W.Outhwaite and W.E.Hewitt.

About one third of the way along the krantz (from the hut end) a very large block separate but leaning against the main face forms a cave. The start of the climb (beaconed) is about 10m beyond this point.

- 1 E2 31m Climb 8m up the recess. Move out to the left and climb 8m up a face into a gully. Scramble 10m. Chimney up 6m to a tree belay.
 - 2 F2 37m Climb 8m up a face to the left of a minor recess in the centre of the main shallow recess. Traverse 3m to the right around a nose into the minor recess, which is climbed for 3m before one moves out to the face on the left. Climb 6m up the face, then traverse 3m to the right to a slingpoint on a tree at the foot of a vertical crack on the right-hand side of the main recess. Move 3m up the crack. Traverse to the left, moving up 6m diagonally to the left-hand wall of the main recess, which is climbed for 3m to a tree belay at the foot of a chimney.
 - 3 F2 36m Climb the chimney for 13m then traverse 6m to the right across a minor recess, onto a near vertical face, to a small but prominent vertical crack. Climb the face for 10m, then traverse 5m back to the left to a ledge. Climb 3m to a large block on the ridge.
 - 4 E2 17m Climb 6m to the top of a pinnacle, then 5m up a grassy face immediately opposite the pinnacle. 6m of scrambling completes the route.
- First ascent: 1959 B.van der Riet, M.Armstrong,
B.Magg and S.Perry.

About a third of the way along the Fourth Sister there is an obvious deep vertical cleft which is very prominent when viewed from the Wolkberg Hut. This route follows the slender rib immediately to the right and provides some good climbing. Start 15m to the right of a huge slab leaning against the rock and immediately below the cleft.

- 1 F2 20m Ascend the central rib on rather vegetated rock to a stance at the foot of the cleft.
- 2 F3 13m Traverse with difficulty 3m to the right to a small loose flake below a small overhang. Pull strenuously through the overhang to a resting place above. Descend to the right (peg) to a slight groove at the far side of the pillar. Climb up a few moves to a small stance and peg belay.
- 3 F3 16m Climb straight up the steep groove above to a stance behind a detached pinnacle.
- 4 E3 35m Follow a line of cracks directly above, passing a tree on the left. Move to the left and up more cracks to a good stance at the top of the semi-detached pillar.
- 5 F3 30m From the left-hand side of the pillar, climb into the obvious groove and up this a few moves until it is possible to climb the pleasant right-hand arete. Below the overhang, step back across the groove (good handholds) and climb this steeply via a small bulge and then more easily to the top.

First ascent: Jan 69 R.Barley and A.Barley.

About halfway along the Fourth Sister at its highest point there is an area of grey rock, as seen from the Yut. Start towards the left-hand side of the grey face at a fig tree and cairn.

1 F1 17m Climb to the left and up the face to a good ledge.

2 F2 30m Traverse horizontally to the right for about 20m, passing two old pegs, to a shallow corner. Climb this for 3m, then diagonally up and to the right to a large block stance.

3 F3 45m Climb a recess and chimney for 10m to a tree. Traverse to the left across the exposed face for 12m to a piton, then climb 3m up a short, difficult face. Move diagonally to the left to large secure flakes. Follow these to a good stance at the foot of a chimney between pinnacle and the main face.

4 F1 12m Climb the chimney to a block stance on top of a pinnacle.

5 F3 35m Traverse 12m to the left until blocked off. Descend greyish rock for 2m and then turn a corner to the left. Cross a shallow recess by climbing diagonally up and to the left for 2m (strenuous). Climb a face to the foot of a chimney and a small stance next to a loose pinnacle.

6 F1 33m Climb 6m up the chimney, then continue to the top over easy, dirty rock.

First ascent: Feb 63 J.Anderson and G.Ladner.
(8,5 hours)

A variation on Chicken.

This route shares the first one and a half pitches off Chicken and crosses it higher up. The lower half follows the very steep left-hand side of the grey face and gives good climbing. The upper half wanders onto grass and deteriorates.

1 F1 17m As for Chicken.

2 F2 23m Traverse horizontally to the right for about 20m, passing two old pegs, to a shallow corner. Move up to a small stance and a peg belay below an obvious groove.

3 F3 30m Climb the groove for 5m to where it steepens and then move on to the left-hand arete. Climb this steeply to a narrow ledge below overhangs (peg runner). Step down slightly and traverse 5m to the left along the obvious line. Make an awkward move up onto a narrow ledge below a prominent steep corner which continues as an overhanging chimney (peg and spike belay).

4 G1 33m Step to the left to avoid the initial overhang and climb a groove with difficulty. Continue carefully up a loose overhanging chimney to a stance with a chock belay at the top.

5 E2 17m Climb the continuation of the chimney to the top of a pillar and descend to a good ledge on the opposite side (Pitch 4 of Chicken in reverse)..

6 F3 30m The objective is the largest tree in the gully across and slightly higher on the right. Climb 10m diagonally to the right and descend 5m to reach a very shallow corner. Climb a slight crack in the right-hand wall of this to reach a grass ledge. Continue to a tree belay in the gully.

7 E2 40m Climb the gully for about 20m then climb steeply to the left up ramps and grass ledges to a ledge at the foot of a grass-filled chimney.

Wolkberg - Fourth Sister

8 E2 30m Move 7m to the left and climb a vegetated chimney, finally surmounting a jammed capstone to reach the top.

First ascent: Jul 69 R.Barley, A.Barley and M.White.

FOURTH SISTER PINNACLE E3

4.8.

Start three-quarters of the way along the 4th Sister. Start at foot of prominent recess which follows up centre of pinnacle.

1 D 17m Climb up recess and chimney to a good chockstone belay.

2 E3 23m Continue up chimney and out onto ramp for last 8m. Scramble through gap to rugged platform between the pinnacle and the main face.

3 E2 10m Climb up top of left-hand pinnacle (i.e. the highest).

First ascent: 1.9.63 P.Fatti, J.Anderson (Jnr),
B.Anderson and I.Barrow.

EGGNOG F3

4.9.

Approach over the Fourth Sister and descend the gully between this and the Fifth Sister. Traverse out to the right (looking down) along ledges to the base of the Dome. This traverse is two-thirds of the way down and is cairned. Traverse under the Dome towards the Hut, to a prominent landslide chute. Start at the left of this behind a large boulder and next to a tree.

11 E2 15m Climb the tree and onto the face. Move past detached blocks to a belay at the base of a chimney.

2 F2 25m Climb a chimney crack using the left-hand face until it steepens (15m). Traverse to the right, taking care on a protruding flake, then climb a corner crack and step to the left to a belay in a chimney.

Wolkberg - Fourth Sister

- 3 E2 20m Climb the chimney and gully to a belay behind the base of a huge pinnacle.
- 4 F2 20m Climb the chimney to a small pinnacle (10m) then climb diagonally up and to the left to a chockstone and belay.
- 5 F1 20m Climb to a chimney directly above to the top of the pinnacle.
- 6 F3 10m Make a big step onto the face behind and use a nutted sling in a crack above to move up and to the right, then easily up through a chimney to the top.

First ascent: Aug 69 A.Barley and R.Barley.

GLUHWEIN SPECIAL F2

4.10.

Approach and start as for Eggnog.

- 1 E2 30m Ascend a tree, step onto the face and move up past detached blocks. Traverse to the right and descend a few metres (huge, detached blocks). Continue up to the right and to a belay on a pinnacle.
- 2 E2 20m Ascend the slanting slab above to the right and move across to the right to a large ledge and block-and-peg belay.
- 3 F2 20m Move to the left and up the left-hand chimney onto a narrow protruding ledge. Continue up to the overhang and move up, using the left-hand wall, to a chock-and-nut belay in a niche above.
- 4 F1 40m Ascend the chimney past trees and continue by bridging up a wide, shallow chimney to a good ledge and peg belay on the left.

First ascent: Sep 69 A.Barley, M.White and B.Honey.

PINNACLE CHIMNEY F1

4.11.

This route is at the western end of the Fourth Sister and about 16m to the left of the start of Matlapetsi Dome. It follows a chimney on the left of a 50m high pinnacle which is near the end of the Fourth Sister.

1 D 32m Ascend the chimney for 32m, climbing the first 10m on the outside. There are three or four chockstones. The crack or chimney continues up the main face directly behind the pinnacle.

2 F1 20m Climb the crack or chimney. The start is awkward and is climbed on the outside, straddling onto the pinnacle. About 3m up one enters the chimney. The second obstacle is a smaller chockstone which blocks the chimney. Climb out over this chockstone and re-enter the chimney. Watch for shattered rock on this and the next pitch.

3 E1 30m Climb the chimney. The middle portion is closed in and dark.

4 D A short pitch of D standard from the exit of the chimney leads to walking ground.

First ascent: Date unknown R.F.Davies and P.Scott.

MATLAPETSI DOME F1

4.12.

1 E2 13m Traverse and ascend to a small stance. The rock is rather shattered.

2 E2 16m Ascend and bear to the right out of sight of the stance, to a big ledge.

3 F 32m Climb a steep crack to end up on a ledge below the final vertical face. (An attractive but difficult finish awaits opening from here.)

4 F1 34m Traverse to the right and climb a recess to the top.

5 C 12m Scramble to the top. The rock is comparatively clean.

First ascent: Christmas 62 R.Davies, B.Magg,
P.Millin and J.Clayton.

The climb is on the 5th Sister just past a bushed gully or kloof. Difficulty will be encountered in traversing the kloof and a better approach would be along the top and down the next gully. Bob led a difficult pitch out of the kloof which was a diagonal up to the right. However the rock was poor and dripping wet, and will probably always be dripping. Near the kloof on the left side of the Sister there is a very prominent crack which extends a long way up the cliff. The climb is a little further to the left.

1 D 16m Start up on the left of a grassy ledge and continue up to a ledge. This ledge extends from the prominent crack leftwards, to where it falls sheer into the gully.

2 E2 8m Towards the left-hand edge of the ledge there is an obvious pitch which is slightly overhanging at the bottom. Just to the left, there is a rock for a belay. This pitch ends on another ledge.

3 F2 30m On the right-hand side there are two cracks. Start climbing on the outside of the right-hand crack until it is easier to traverse to the left into the crack, which is about 5m up. Continue up to a substantial ledge.

4 G2 20m (Jacob's Pitch) This goes straight up from the right-hand side of the ledge, where there is a crack. Under the small overhang traverse left, where there is a small stance. However, it is best to continue up diagonally to the right to a stance from which a vertical belay can be given.

5 E2 16m The general direction is up to the left onto a grassy slope.

First ascent: 25.3.51 R.Latham and D.Bell.

Immediately to the right of Matlapetsi Dome is the tree-filled descent gully and then a long section of steep crag. About halfway along this is a wide, reddish, tree-filled recess. The Big Corner takes a huge right-angled corner about 80m to the right of this and very obvious as viewed from the Dome. Approach from the Hut via a gully between the Second and Third Sisters, then go downhill gently to the top of the recess (1,25 hours). Abseil down recess to the bottom of the crag. Guarding the base of the corner is a 15m buttress. Start below a chimney about 20m to the left of this.

1 E2 31m Climb the chimney and step out to the right to a grassy ledge which leads up to the right to the foot of the corner.

2 F1 30m Climb the corner mainly on the left-hand wall to a small sentry-box stance in the corner and a peg belay.

3 F3 22m Climb the chimney for 10m to an overhang step to the right to a smaller chimney and pull around the overhang into the continuation of the chimney above (crux). Climb this to a good ledge on the right (peg belay).

4 F3 22m The corner continues above as a loose chimney which is avoided. Make a very exposed traverse to the right on a narrow ledge until an awkward mantelshelf leads to the arete. Climb up easily to the left to a ledge and belay above the traverse.

5 F1 22m Climb to the right to small pinnacle then up the wall above to finish.

First ascent: Easter 69 R.Barley, A.Barley and M.White.

Wolkberg - Fifth Sister

BIG CRACK G1

5.3.

The route starts immediately below Big Corner and ascends diagonally to the right to finish up a 25m, sharp-cut chimney crack through the top overhangs. Only pitch 5 makes the climb worthwhile.

1 E2 30m Ascend the corner (this is directly below Big Corner itself) to where it steepens, then traverse to the right and diagonally up to a good ledge and tree belay.

2 E2 20m Move up from the tree, back to the left and diagonally to the right to a belay in the bushy recess.

3 E2 40m Ascend the line above through vegetation to gain a ledge below the wall which leads up to the overhang. Traverse to the left to a tree belay near the base of the big crack line.

4 F2 15m Move to the left and ascend an awkward groove, then continue to a chockstone belay at the base of the big crack.

5 G1 40m Ascend the big crack (two peg runners, difficult to place) strenuously to its top (25m), using the left-hand wall at times. Ascend the corner above on loose rock, then climb up the left to a belay.

6 D 15m Scramble to the top.

First ascent: Jul 69 A.Barley, R.Barley and M.White

Wolkberg - Fifth Sister

MATLAPETSI CRACK E2

5.4.

This route follows a prominent crack and is a clean and uncontrived route by Wolkberg standards. The Fourth and Fifth Sisters are separated by a heavily wooded gully. The slopes below the left-hand half of the Fifth Sister are thickly covered with bush. For these reasons it is preferable, when travelling from the Hut, to ascend one of the gullies above the Hut, walk along the top, descend a gully at the right-hand end of the Fifth Sister and walk back to the left along the base of the rock to the climb.

The first 31m or so must be taken carefully owing to some loose rock. Pass through an eye to enter a deep part of the crack. Ascend the left-hand wall (facing in) of the crack, passing behind chockstones. The stance is on large chockstones. Continue up the crack until the last 10m, when one climbs slightly to the left.

First ascent: 1955 R.Davies, J.Clayton, D.Mitchell
and E.Lude.

Wolkberg - Other Areas

HORNS PINNACLE F1 or F2

1.

Approach via the Tabina track and the nek between the horns. Descend the gully through forest for about 60m to where ledges break right towards the pinnacle. One of these provides a suitable route but the easiest way is probably to descend a few metres more and climb a 3m wall with the aid of the base of a large tree. This leads to easy scrambling up and left to the pinnacle base where there is a cave under a big chockstone.

1 E3 30m Begin in chimney 10m to left of cave and climb directly to small knob on left ridge. Continue on this left wall and back to centre to reach main ledge (level with top of huge chock/block to right).

Either 2a F2 20m Traverse 2m left to obvious crack. Follow this up to roof and move left onto exposed face and up to top.

Or 2b F1 30m Traverse around right to opposite side of pinnacle (south face) and ascend more vegetated ledges, etc. to top. This is apparently the route of the first ascent.

First ascent: 2b Early 1950's, possibly by C.Thompson
2a 1969 H.Vogl, L.Vogl, H.Leibsch and R.Stapley.
